- ❖ **Andhra Pradesh Judicial Services Exam Eligibility Criteria:**
 - Applicants must have completed **LL.B** from any recognized institute.
 - Age limit- not more than **35 years (For SC/ST 5 year Relaxation)**
 - Candidate must have completed 3 years as a practising advocate

- ❖ **SELECTION PROCESS:**
 - Preliminary Examination → Objective Type- multiple choice questions.
 - Mains Examination → Narrative or Essay Type
 - Viva-Voce → Personal Interview
 - **Exam Pattern-** The Examination Pattern will be as follows:

- The screening test will be a computer-based test and the questions asked in this stage will be Multiple choice types. (100 marks 2 hours)
