### SCHEME AND SYLLABUS

- ❖ **Karnataka Judicial Services Exam Eligibility Criteria:**
  - Applicants must have completed **LL.B** from any recognized institute.
  - The **SC or ST applicants must be of 38 years** of age.
  - For the unreserved candidates, the age limit is **35 years of age**.
- ❖ **SELECTION PROCESS:**
  - Preliminary Examination → **Objective Type**- multiple choice questions.
  - Mains Examination → **written type**.
  - Viva-Voce → **Personal Interview**
  - **Negative marking of 0.25 will be deducted in the prelim's examination.**

***MAINS EXAM SYLLABUS***

❖ **Syllabus prescribed for main written examination.**

- The main examination will be conducted in three papers.
- Each paper comprises 150 Questions. One paper in Civil Law & another paper in Criminal Law will be conducted.
- mains exam will be conducted the exam in **4 papers of 100 marks** each.

❖ **TRANSLATION PAPER**



There will be one translation paper and candidates have to translate passages in English to Kannada and Kannada into English. Passages will be from Depositions, Judgments, Documents.

**VIVA- VOCE (INTERVIEW)**

- ❖ The interview will carry **50 marks**.

**Note:** Candidates have to secure a minimum of 60% marks in the preliminary examination for qualifying for the exam and Candidates belonging to SC & ST have to score a minimum of 50% marks.
