SCHEME AND SYLLABUS

❖ Punjab Judicial Services Exam Eligibility Criteria:

- Applicants must have completed **LL.B** from any recognized institute.
- The age Limit-**21 – 37 year (For SC/ST/OBC 5 years Relaxation)**
- **Punjabi Language skills of Matric or its equivalent Standard. (Reading, Writing, Spoken)**
- Upper age limit is relaxed up to 45 years for all States/Central Government employees.
- Ex-servicemen of Punjab Domicile shall be allowed to deduct the period of his service in the Armed Forces of Union from his actual age and if the resultant age does not exceed the maximum age limit prescribed for direct appointment to such a vacancy in the Service Rules concerned by more than three years, they shall be deemed to satisfy the condition regarding age limit.
- Upper age limit is also relaxed up to 42 years for Widows, Divorced women and certain other Categories of Women.
- Upper age limit is also relaxed up to 47 years for Physically Handicapped persons who have domicile of Punjab.

❖ SELECTION PROCESS:

- Preliminary Examination → **Objective Type**- multiple choice questions.
- Mains Examination → **subjective/narrative type**
- Viva-Voce → **Personal Interview**
- **Exam Pattern**- The Examination Pattern will be as follows:

PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

❖ Punjab Judiciary Prelims Exam pattern

- The preliminary Exam is a computer mode of the exam including Multiple Choice Questions.
- There are a total of 125 questions in the exam.
- There is a **negative marking for 0.20% marks** for each wrong answer.
- The total marking scheme for the **Prelims exam is 500 marks 2 hours.**

SUBJECT FOR PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION

- ❖ **The preliminary examination shall be of objective type with multiple- choice questions as given below:**

No candidate shall be allowed to appear in the main Examination unless he/she secured minimum 150 marks (100 marks for all reserved category candidates) in the preliminary examination. The marks obtained in the preliminary examination shall not be counted towards result.

- ❖ **Syllabus prescribed for main written examination.**
- In the Mains Exam Level of the Punjab Judiciary Exam, there are also five-sections (**Civil Law I, Civil Law-II, Criminal Law, English Language, Punjabi Language**). ❖ **Paper V Punjabi Language (150. Marks)**

- Language- Punjabi in Gurmukhi Script, No book prescribed.

VIVA- VOCE (INTERVIEW)

- (i) The Viva-Voce shall carry **100 marks** and result shall be prepared based on the Grand Total of the marks obtained by the candidates in the Main Examination and the Viva-Voce.
- (ii) **No candidate shall be called for the Viva-Voce unless he obtains at least 50% qualifying marks in the aggregate of all the written papers and qualifies in language paper Punjabi (Gurmukhi Script). The candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes of Punjab, Backward Classes of Punjab and Physically Handicapped, Punjab shall be called for the Viva-Voce test if they obtain 45% qualifying marks in the aggregate of all written papers and qualify in Language Paper Punjabi (Gurmukhi Script).**
- (iii) No candidate shall be considered to have qualified unless he/she **obtains 50% marks (read 45% marks for the SC/BC/Physically Handicapped, Punjab category candidates)** in aggregate out of the total marks of the written examination and viva- voce.
- (iv) The Viva-Voce shall relate to matters of general interest and is intended to test the candidate's alertness intelligence and general outlook. It shall be conducted in English.
- (v) No candidate shall be considered to have qualified for appointment

- (vi) based on marks secured only in the Main Written Examination unless he/she appears for viva-voce
